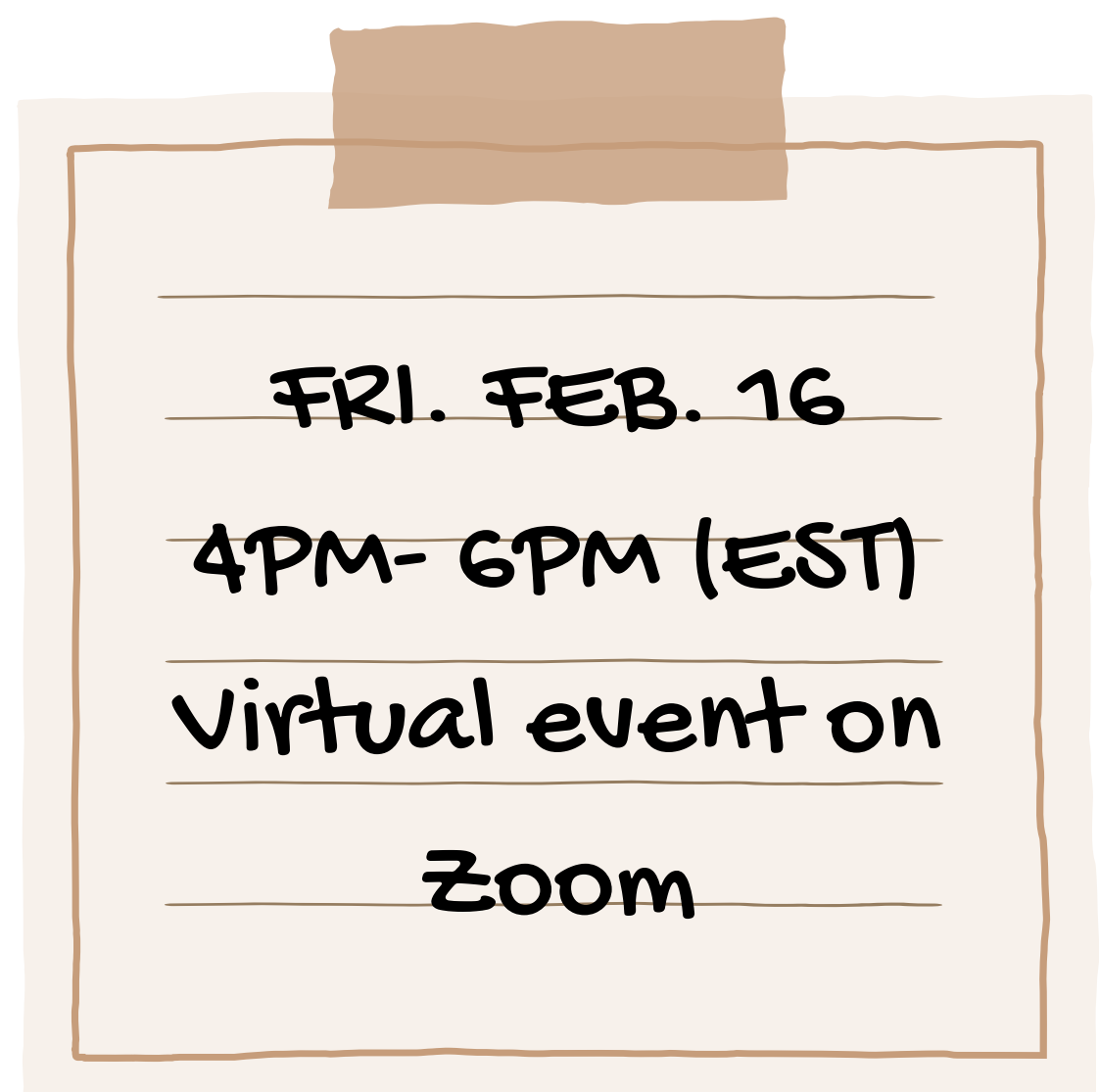


UNSETTLING ANTHROPOLOGY

VIOLENCE , TERROR & RESISTANCE

The recent calls to moralize violence, to condemn or to relativize it, disregard the inherently political nature of violence, that violence 'creates and sustains' political meanings (Paul Kahn 2008). This talk series focuses on political imagination behind all acts of violence, of the willingness of people to kill and be killed and, especially, aims to unsettle common assumptions and moral rhetorics which are pressed down upon us to condemn the violence of 'the others', disregarding the meanings of and the historical context of their actions.
